APM HEALTH SERVICES

APM provides an array of professional behavioral health care services. Health care providers, psychiatrists, therapists, case managers, peer support specialists and other staff work together as a single team to treat the whole you, in two convenient locations in Philadelphia.

Behavioral Health

APM operates two Drug and Alcohol Outpatient clinics and with medication assisted Suboxone treatment and three mental outpatient health clinics delivering professional, culturally sensitive treatment and prevention services to more than 3,800 City residents without geographic restriction. All services offer bilingual diagnoses and treatment for our community's mental health issues.



APM Mental Health provides the following specific services:

- Individual Therapy
- Family and Group Therapy
- Psychiatric Evaluations
- Psychiatric Intervention
- Medication Monitoring
- Couples Counseling



Family Therapy

The goal of family therapy is to facilitate improved communication, strengthen family bonds and solve family problems. Our therapists seek to help families understand and handle special situations such as death, mental illness, along with child and adolescent issues. The main objective is to help families create a better functioning home environment.

Drug & Alcohol Treatment

APM provides intensive and regular outpatient services to individuals, and group therapy for people with a history of substance abuse. Our staff is bilingual, culturally sensitive, and ready to meet the specific needs of individuals. Our clinicians are trained in Cognitive Behavioral and Prolonged Exposure Therapy.

Support Services

APM Support service programs provide long-term help to the homeless by providing housing assistance and services that provide the tools necessary for successful independent living. APM also has a limited number of housing options for individuals diagnosed with co-occurring disorders, including substance abuse, mental health, and/or HIV/AIDS.
